



The statistics presented in the 4th quarter report account for all incidents reported to York University Security Services between February 1, 2015 and April 30, 2015 which occurred on or in relation to the Keele or Glendon Campuses.

Incidents:

The number of incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 21% to 576 incidents compared to 475 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014. The total number of incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 25% to 1,918 incidents compared to 1,534 incidents reported in 2013-2014.

Calls for Service:

The number of calls for service received in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 decreased by 10% to 2,498 compared to 2,777 calls for service received in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014. The total number of calls for service received in 2014-2015 increased by 4% to 10,860 compared to 10,441 calls for service received in 2013-2014.

The top five incident categories reported accounted for 296 incidents or 51% of the total incidents reported during the 4th quarter of 2014-2015. The top five incident categories are ranked as per the following:

Emergency Medical

The number of Emergency Medical incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 2% to 92 incidents compared to 90 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Emergency Medical incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 5% to 343 incidents compared to 326 incidents reported in 2013-2014

Theft Under \$5000 - Private Property

The number of Theft Under \$5000 – Private Property incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 decreased by 21% to 65 incidents compared to 82 incidents reported in the 4th guarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Theft Under \$5000 – Private Property incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by less than 1% to 218 incidents compared to 217 incidents reported in 2013-2014

Disorderly Behaviour

The number of Disorderly Behaviour incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 59% to 51 incidents compared to 32 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Disorderly Behaviour incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 45% to 125 incidents compared to 86 incidents reported in 2013-2014 Fire Alarms

The number of Fire Alarm incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 decreased by 8% to 45 incidents compared to 49 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Fire Alarm incidents reported in 2014-2015 decreased by 2% to 196 incidents compared to 199 incidents reported in 2013-2014

Mischief Under \$5000 - University Property


The number of Mischief Under \$5000 - University Property incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 19% to 43 incidents compared to 36 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Mischief Under \$5000 – University Property incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 62% to 178 incidents compared to 110 incidents reported in 2013-2014

All incidents presented in this report have been categorized as part of an incident classification hierarchy. The incident classifications are as follows:

Incidents Affecting Quality of Life

The number of Incidents Affecting Quality of Life reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 27.5% to 287 incidents compared to 225 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Incidents Affecting Quality of Life reported in 2014-2015 increased by 22% to 962 incidents compared to 789 incidents reported in 2013-2014 **Property Crimes**

The number of Property Crime incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 decreased by less than 1% to 141 incidents compared to 142 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Property Crime incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 22% to 497 incidents compared to 407 incidents reported in 2013-2014

Crimes Against Persons

The number of Crimes Against Persons incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 39% to 50 incidents compared to 36 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014

The total number of Crimes Against Persons incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 26% to 145 incidents compared to 115 incidents reported in 2013-2014 Other Incidents

The number of Other Incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2014-2015 increased by 36% to 98 incidents compared to 72 incidents reported in the 4th quarter of 2013-2014 The total number of Other Incidents reported in 2014-2015 increased by 41% to 314 incidents compared to 223 incidents reported in 2013-2014
