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# **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

#### PERCENTAGE CHANGE:

Percentage Change refers to the % increase or decrease from the previous time frame.

#### RATE:

Rate refers to Rate of Crime per 1,000 persons.

#### **REPORTED:**

Reported refers to the number of incidents which occurred on or in relation to University property that were reported to York University Security Services.

# **NOT SPECIFIED AREA (NSA):**

Not Specified Area refers to incidents that have been reported to York University Security Services without a specific location or the specific location is undetermined.

#### **OFFENCE:**

An Offence is any violation of Federal Laws, Provincial Statutes or Municipal by-laws.

#### **PROPERTY CRIMES:**

Property Crimes involve unlawful acts with respect to property but do not involve the use or threat of violence against a person. These include: actual and attempted break and enter, theft, mischief, arson, and fraud categories.

# **CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS:**

Crimes Against Persons involve the application and/or threat of violence to a person. These include: sexual assaults, non-sexual assaults, harassment, homicide, abduction, indecent acts, intimidation, robbery, and uttering threats categories.

## **INCIDENTS AFFECTING QUALITY OF LIFE:**

Incidents Affecting Quality of Life involve unlawful acts that do not pose a direct threat to an individual but have an impact as to the perception of safety and fear of crime. These include: bomb threats, disorderly behaviour, cause disturbance, smoking complaints, damage, emergency medical, fire alarms, suspicious vehicles and persons, trespass, occupations & demonstrations, and hate incident categories.

#### OTHER INCIDENTS:

Other Incidents include: information, unfounded occurrences, hazardous substances, missing persons, and motor vehicle collision categories, among others.

# INTRODUCTION

#### **DATA COLLECTION and SOURCE:**

The data contained in this report is taken from the York University Security Services Computer Information Systems. These systems are as follows:

- Resolver (Formerly PPM2000) PERSPECTIVE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
- Resolver (Formerly PPM2000) DISPATCH LOG

It should be noted that as the above systems are being updated continuously during the course of an investigation into an incident, changes to statistics in previous reports are common and expected.

#### **COLLECTION OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE STATISTICS:**

Please note that the reported sexual violence statistics only represent incidents reported to York Security Services. These statistics do not reflect cases reported in confidence to the Sexual Violence Response Office (SVRO). As of September 2016, survivors have the option of reporting cases to the SVRO. Notification to police is only done at the direction of the survivor unless there is an imminent threat to community safety. SVRO is the lead intake and coordinating office for sexual violence reports. Accordingly, SVRO maintains their own statistics. Survivors still have the option of reporting to York Security Services, Community Safety Department, if they wish in addition to reporting to SVRO.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Highlights

The statistics presented in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter report account for all incidents reported to York University Security Services between August 1, 2016 and October 31, 2016 which occurred on or in relation to the Keele or Glendon Campuses.

## **Incidents:**

- The number of incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 3% to 514 incidents compared to 528 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016.
- The total number of incidents reported in 2016-2017 Year to Date (YTD) decreased by 3% to 803 incidents compared to 831 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016.

## **Calls for Service:**

- The number of calls for service received in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 25% to 1,803 calls compared to 2,389 calls for service received in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016.
- ➤ The total number of calls for service received in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 20% to 3,244 compared to 4,031 calls for service received during the same period in 2015-2016.

# **Top Five Incidents Categories:**

The top five incident categories reported accounted for 305 incidents or 59% of the total incidents reported in the  $2^{nd}$  quarter of 2016-2017. The top five incident categories are ranked as per the following:

## > Emergency Medical

- The number of Emergency Medical incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 17% to 112 incidents compared to 135 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Emergency Medical incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 16% to 162 incidents compared to 192 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

# > Theft Under \$5000 - Private Property

- The number of Theft Under \$5000 Private Property incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 increased by 15% to 62 incidents compared to 54 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Theft Under \$5000 Private Property incidents reported in 2016-2017
   YTD remained unchanged at 92 incidents

# > Fire Alarms

- The number of Fire Alarm incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 increased by 30% to 57 incidents compared to 44 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Fire Alarm incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD increased by 22% to 99 incidents compared 81 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

#### Mischief Under \$5000 – University Property

- The number of Mischief Under \$5000 University Property incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 increased by 54% to 43 incidents compared to 28 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Mischief Under \$5000 University Property incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD increased by 13% to 59 incidents compared to 52 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

## Disorderly Behaviour

- The number of Disorderly Behaviour incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 6% to 31 incidents compared to 33 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Disorderly Behaviour incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD increased by 30% to 56 incidents compared to 43 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

## **Incident Classification:**

All incidents presented in this report have been categorized as part of an incident classification hierarchy. The incident classifications are as follows:

## Incidents Affecting Quality of Life

- The number of Incidents Affecting Quality of Life reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 10% to 255 incidents compared to 284 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Incidents Affecting Quality of Life reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 2% to 413 incidents compared to 423 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

# Property Crimes

- The number of Property Crime incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 increased by 19% to 129 incidents compared to 108 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Property Crime incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD remained unchanged at 196 incidents

#### Crimes Against Persons

- The number of Crimes Against Persons incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 3% to 38 incidents compared to 39 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Crimes Against Persons incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 8% to 60 incidents compared to 65 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

#### Other Incidents

- The number of Other Incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 5% to 92 incidents compared to 97 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016
- The total number of Other Incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 9% to 134 incidents compared to 147 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016

## **Selected Violent Crimes:**

The following incident categories have been selected as a measure of violent crimes that have been reported to York University Security Services:

# > Non-Sexual Assault

- The number of Non-Sexual Assault incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 decreased by 40% to 3 incidents compared to 5 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016\*
- The total number of Non-Sexual Assault incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 30% to 7 incidents compared to 10 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016\*

#### Sexual Assault

- The number of Sexual Assault incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 increased by 33% to 4 incidents compared to 3 incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015-2016\*
- The total number of Sexual Assault incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 20% to 4 incidents compared to 5 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016\*

#### Robbery


- The number of Robbery incidents reported in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2016-2017 remained unchanged at 1 incident
- The total number of Robbery incidents reported in 2016-2017 YTD decreased by 67% to 1 incident compared to 3 incidents reported during the same period in 2015-2016\*


